

Assisted Living Facility Discharge Notices Rights and Regulations When Facilities Close

The Long Term Care Ombudsman has been notified that your assisted living facility will be closing. There are regulations which must be followed during facility closure.

- Each resident is required to receive a discharge notice
- The Assisted Living Facility is required to notify the State Long Term Care Ombudsman about the facility closure and share discharge notices
- The Long Term Care Ombudsman program completes an assisted living discharge interview; participation by the resident or family member is **optional**

During a facility closure, the resident retains rights.

- The right to quality care and services until the facility closes
- The right to choose where they will move
- The right to a safe discharge
- The right to interact with individuals of their choice
- The right to NOT interact with individuals (other facilities or agencies may visit the facility and go door to door; residents do not have to respond)
